A lonesome 8-year-old girl is invited over to her cult-like neighbor's house for a series of play dates.






## LOST OR STOLEN

An overwhelmed single mother falls into a traumatic spiral of suspicions after her house got broken into, constantly trying to prove that she can still keep her children - and herself - safe.




## HOMECOMING

As a group of emerging women directors who are majority BIPOC and including LGBTQIA+ identified, we are uniquely qualified to tell a series of stories about underrepresented women. We aim to fill in the perspectives largely left out of American history. In these seven stories, we examine the role of the home through the decades as a sacred space vs. a cage. As 80% of those dropping out of the workforce due to the pandemic are women, we as a society are forced to examine our relationships with our homes. This film is our way of challenging the setbacks and sense of regression that we experience as women today.


